

Frequently Asked Questions - MIX

What is MIX?

- MIX is a four-day summer event specifically designed for students in sixth, seventh and eighth grades. It is intentionally crafted in ways that will engage middle school students through tactile, interactive and fun activities coupled with Bible-based teaching and small group interaction. Where does this event take place?

- On the campus of Lee University in Cleveland, Tennessee (30 minutes east of Chattanooga).

When does this event take place?

- Sunday, June 20th (we will depart around 9 AM) – Thursday, June 24th (we will return around 11 AM)

Where do you stay?

- We stay on the campus of Lee University in either dorms or apartment style housing (this is determined by Christ in Youth the week before the event).

How many students are in a room?

- That depends on if we are assigned dorms (2) or apartments (4-6)

What/where do they eat?

- Sunday dinner through Wednesday dinner (minus one meal which we will supply) their registration cost includes meals in the Lee University Cafeteria. There are also several restaurants on campus (Chick-Fil-A, Subway, Dunkin Donuts & Einstein Bros). Meals at these restaurants are not included in the registration fee.

How much money should my student bring?

- Cash for 3 meals (2 lunches and a breakfast) and any money they would like to spend on snacks, conference apparel, food on campus or offering.

What does a typical day at MIX look like?

- Breakfast, Morning Session (Worship/Speaker/Stage Games), Small Group Time, Lunch, Free Time, Outer Realm (outside interactive games/activities), Dinner, Evening Session (Worship/Speaker/Stage Games), Large Group Time, In Dorm/Lights Out

How many Leaders will go to MIX?

- This depends on how many students we take. Our goal is 1 leader to every 5 students.

What if my student takes medication?

- Students are responsible for keeping and taking their own medication unless adult supervision/administration is required.
